Australian Air Force makes emergency landing at DZR Airport

TACLOBAN CITY-An Australian Air Force aircraft had an emergency landing at the Daniel Z. Romualdez Airport (DZR) Airport, this city, on Saturday loaded with 46 passengers.

The Royal Australian Air Force Aircraft ASY 727, a Boeing C17 Globemaster III type of aircraft with Aircraft Registration A41-209 as described by the Civil Aviation Authority of the Philippines (CAAP) Tacloban Office, made the emergency landing at about 12:47 pm.

The airplane was from Kadana, Japan and was on its way to Edinburgh, South Australia, when it had its emergency landing at the DZR Airport, CAAP said in a statement.

While the reason for the emergency landing of the Australian Air Force plane has yet to be known as of this writing, a source said that fumes were observed emitting from the aircraft cockpit, forcing the pilots, Captain Matthew Dank and Kurt Ehrlich - Senicic, to make the emergency landing.

None of the 46 passengers of the aircraft were reported to have been hurt due to the incident.

CAAP Tacloban, through its Air Traffic Ser-

vice (ATS), Crash Fire Rescue (CFR) Unit, and Security and Intelligence Service (CSIS) made a quick response to the aircraft carrying 46 crew members and aircraft officials.

Based on the initial information from Tactical Operations Group (TOG) whose headquarter is located inside the airport premises, the Australian Air Force was loaded with eight crew members and 38 passengers.

Military also says the 3 are treated well Katungod claims military arrested 3 farmers; military says they were NPA members

TACLOBAN CITY-A progressive human rights group based in this city reported that three peasant members were detained by soldiers in Northern Samar on October 2, an allegation vehemently denied by the government troops.

Alexander Abiguna of Katungod Sinirangan Bisayas said that detained by the members of the 20th Infantry Battalion, which is based in Catubig town, Northern Samar, were Christian Sabado, who belong to a peasant group, Northern Samar Small Farmers' Association (NSSFA), Anton Manoso, and Edson Piczon, whom he said to be village watchmen of Barangay Hina-

gonoyan, Catubig town.

Abiguna claimed that the three were on their way to Brgy. San Francisco, Las Navas town, also in Northern Samar, reportedly to conduct investigation on the pest infestation affecting the abaca industry in the town and the impact among coconut farmers on the low price of copra when they were apprehended by the government troops on that day at about 11 am.

"They were made to lie face down on the ground while the soldiers stepped on them multiple times. It also appears that they were manhandled and physically abused upon arrest," he said.

Abiguna said that they

condemns the 'intimidation and harassment of the civilians as they demanded for the immediate release of the three.

But this allegations of Abiguna was dispelled by the military saying the three were not physically abused during their arrest.

In a post on their Facebook account, the 20th IB, which is under the command of Lt.Col. Juan Gullem, said they were not farmers contrary to Abiguna's claims but members of the New People's Army(NPA).

The government troops were in the area as part of their security patrol when they chanced upon Sabado and his

DILG provides funding for construction of water system to a Southern Leyte town

HINUNANGAN, Southern Leyte – Problem on low supply of water being experienced by the concessionaires of this town is now a thing of the past.

This after the Department of Interior and Local Government(DILG) funded the construction of a level III water system project amounting to P22 million for the town.

And this bit of good news was welcome by Dannioca Piga, who said that just like the more than 3,550 water members of the town, they have been complaining on the poor services being rendered by the local government run-water district office.

According to the 28-year old housewife, they have to wait for hours for their taps to have water which they uses for their daily needs.

"Problem on water is experienced during morning which is at its peak because many are using it for bathing," Piga said.

Her family uses at least two pails of water for each person who takes a bath, this aside from cooking, laundry and other chores.

"We don't mind if there

will be an increase on water rate for as long as the water supply is enough and efficient," Piga added.

With only one water system operating serving 3,552 water concessionaire, supply of water in this municipality, particularly within its town center, is not enough, as constructing an additional water system will be costly for the local government to build, Mayor Reynaldo Fernandez said.

Thus, they were grateful that the DILG provided them the needed funds to build another water system, the town mayor added.

The existing water supply coming from Magatas Spring would no longer be sufficient to supply the growing population of the town.

The Hinunangan Water District is expecting that an additional 1,000 households will benefit from this new water supply.

Mayor Fernandez said that supply of safe and potable water is one of the main problems of all local government units like Hinunangan.

"Without our government assisting disadvantage municipalities, this kind of

high-impact project is unachievable for local government units with problem on funding. In most cases we will resort to loan but with this assistance, we are able to implement it because the national government provided us the funds," Fernandez said.

The DILG provided P22 million fund for the construction of the new water system which involved the construction of the water plant facility equipped with modern filtration processing, construction of big tank with five cells for sanitizing the raw water from the source, development at the water source area and the pipelines, among other materials needed.

JIPAPAD, Eastern Samar – The mayor of this town said that they have now reached 90 percent on the clearing operations involving public streets.

However, they have to finish their town fiesta first before they could demolish the remaining structures, town Mayor Benjamin Ver said.

According to Ver, these structures are located in the area leading to the town proper.

The town mayor said that the owners of these

celebration for the owners to demolish parts of their houses that obstructs the road," he added.

Affected houses are all made of light materials and already marked by the local government.

"The owners volunteers to demolish portion of their houses encroaching the road. Our residents are cooperating because they see this program is implemented not only in our town but in the whole country," Mayor Ver said.

Mayor Ver said that in view of the request of the house owners, they have asked the evaluators from the Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG) to give them grace period of at least 10 days due to this appeal of the owners.

drigo Duterte to clear all obstructions in public streets and roads during his State of the Nation Address (Sona) early this year.

LGUs were given 60 days to comply with the memorandum issued by the DILG which lapsed last Sept.30.

"We are already at 90 percent in clearing our roads within the town proper, our only problem is the more than 20 houses in the access road leading to the town," Mayor Ver said.

"We asked the DILG evaluators to give us 10 days after the town fiesta

Mayor Ver added that he is thankful for Pres. Duterte for issuing the order to clear the streets and roads from obstruction making it easier for local chief executives to implement.

"From that on, we will strictly implement that policy," Ver said.

Personnel from the Municipal Local Government Operations Officers, Bureau of Fire Protection, Philippine National Police, barangay officials and employees of the LGU enforces the clearing operations.

Rep. Garin calls on Health Sec. Duque to discipline his ranks

Former Secretary of Health and Iloilo 1st district Representative Janette Loreto-Garin lashed out at Sec. Francisco Duque's leadership when on a TV Patrol news segment released Friday night, Centers for Health Development (CHD) 4A Director Eduardo Janairo stated that the Philippines does not use meningococcal vaccine because it is not yet proven to be effective and is still under study.

Garin, who has training in Advanced Vaccinology, called on Duque to put order in his house.

"I call on Sec. Duque to discipline his people and hold them accountable for spreading disinformation. Declarations like that of Dr. Janairo's can be misconstrued as a policy statement whether he was acting as a representative of DOH or not. Reckless utterances like this is detrimental to public health," she said in a press statement.

The United States (USA) has already licensed two types of meningococcal vaccines - i.) Meningococcal conjugate vaccines (MenACWY); and, ii.) Serogroup B meningococcal vaccines (MenB) which have helped teens and young adults prevent its most

common causes.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the health protection agency that protects America from health and safety threats for both foreign and domestic, has seen meningococcal disease as a very serious illness where death can occur in as little as few hours.

"I am deeply concerned that these isolated cases might erupt into a widespread panic due to complete disregard to the truth: that we have a vaccine for meningococemia proven to combat the disease," Garin said.

Furthermore, the World Health Organization (WHO) established a Working Group (WG) to prepare a Strategic Advisory Group of Experts (SAGE) review of new evidence and advice to WHO on the use of meningococcal vaccines to mitigate the public health impact of the disease in May 2019.

The former Secretary of Health said the reason why the vaccine is not given

routinely in the Philippine public health program is that the burden based on history is not that huge. But despite this, private patients and some doctors use this.

As a medical practitioner, Garin urged Filipinos who have symptoms of meningococcal disease to urgently go and see a doctor, especially if there is a persistent drowsiness, irritability, fever, children not feeding normally or if symptoms have come on or just worsened very quickly.

She further stood firm, maintaining that "the incidence, prevalence, morbidity, and mortality of many communicable diseases like meningococemia will not rise if we subscribe to an adage which holds true even today - that an ounce of prevention is always better than a pound of cure."

It can be recalled that this is the third time Garin called on the DOH's attention regarding the misplaced programs of Janairo.

The first was about the useless dengue kits (loot bag with goodies) during dengue outbreak and second was the hiring of an event organizer posing as an expert panel in dengue only to find out that Vir-eoload Works was in the main business of providing cellphone load. (PR)

Tacloban city gov't conducts anti-dengue activities in the barangays

TACLOBAN CITY-To continually bring down the cases of dengue in the city, the local government of Tacloban has scheduled larval survey, fogging and search and destroy activities in five densely-populated barangays from October 1 to 10, 2019.

City Health Office (CHO) personnel first conducted a larval survey and fogging activities in Brgy. 60 Sagkahan on October 4 and 5, while fogging was conducted in Brgy. 76 Fatima on October 4.

Larval survey or mosquito surveillance is done

to identify mosquito-breeding sites while fogging uses pesticides to kill mosquitoes in communities with monitored cases of dengue.

Meantime, search and destroy activities was conducted in Barangays 93 Bagacay (October 2-6), 68 Anibong (October 3-7), 67 Anibong (October 4-8), 76 Fatima (October 5 -9), and 60 Sagkahan (October 6-10).

During a community outreach program in the northern barangays, Mayor Alfred S. Romualdez announced the drop of dengue cases in the city.

He was however quick to remind the residents not to be complacent and do what's necessary to combat dengue; like covering water containers and keeping surroundings clean.

As of this writing, no new dengue cases or deaths were reported by the CHO.

Dengue rapid test and other health interventions for dengue patients, meanwhile remain available in the seven district health centers of the local government.

DPWH prompts contractors to speed up infra projects

CARIGARA, Leyte-District Engineer Gerald Pacanan of the Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH)-Leyte Second District Engineering Office has asked the contractors to expedite project implementation to keep up with the monthly target accomplishments of the office.

"As we begin the fourth quarter of the fiscal year, let us all work

together to reach our target accomplishments and complete project implementation for 2019," said Pacanan.

The meeting aimed to tackle issues, concerns and updates on the commitments signed by the contractors.

"Beginning the last quarter, we already need to bid projects for 2020 implementation, so contractors must be compliant

with their commitments to continue their partnership with us," added Pacanan.

For this fiscal year, Leyte 2 is tasked to implement 87 projects worth P1.57 billion covering road and bridge improvement projects and construction of other government facilities of which 32 are already completed, 52 are ongoing, and 3 Not Yet Started (NYS). (PR)

It instead created a reverberating cry that sounded calls for justice. Calls for investigation immediately hugged mainstream media. The incident caused the top officials of the academy to resign on grounds of command responsibility.

As the public gets informed with the details of that horrible murderous act on a hapless and defenseless cadet to submitted himself to that fateful end of his life, there are well-meaning soldiers who passed through the hallowed grounds of that premier military academy posing the challenge to stop the practice of hazing. It would take batches of cadets to sacrifice holding retaliation on their underclassmen out of the castigation they went through during their plebe year. Should that happen, cadets will be passing into the elite soldiers of that officers corps and not as corpse akin to the cadet who fell into the nightmare of his fallen dream.

Children’s health condition in North Samar town shows dramatic increase due to supplemental feeding program of the DSWD

BOBON, Northern Samar - This town has more than P15 million budget for the supplemental feeding program (SFP) as funded by the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD), said town’s welfare and development officer.

Elsie Mora told Leyte Samar Daily Express in an interview here that the fruitful and effective SFP has greatly help reduced the malnutrition problem in this municipality.

She added that for eight years now, 9,311 day care children in this town have improved their health with the successful implementation of the SFP.

Mora reported that since 2011 up to 2018, the government has spent P15.39 million for the implementation of the SFP in their town.

She also reported that there are 44 day care workers in the town’s 34 child development centers serving in SF program in the local government of Bobon.

Mora said that the successful implementation of the supplemental feeding program has resulted to a 96 percent improvement on the nutrition and health of

the day care children beneficiaries.

Mora added that SF program is a big contributor in response of malnutrition problem as children were able to access free and eat nutritious food while at Day Care Center.

Parents were able to gain knowledge in cooking low cost menu that they will bring it their family, she added. This mitigate hunger, educate parents through intensified nutrition and health education and encourage parents participative in community work.

“SF program has a great help in solving malnutrition problem of the communi-

ty. The poor families able to access this program for free. This also help the family beneficiaries augment in meeting the nutrition and needs of each child. The health status is being improved and the parents are able to acquired knowledge and skills in preparing low cost but nutritious food,” Mora stressed.

According to the records of the DSWD regional office 8, based in Tacloban City, the municipality of Bobon is one of the top 10 municipalities in Eastern Visayas that has been continuously implementing the program since 2011.

Second quarter fishery production in Eastern Visayas up by 12.1 percent

The fishing industry in Eastern Visayas expanded as the region's total fishery production went up to 30,408 metric tons (MT) during the second quarter in 2019 from 27,124 MT in the same quarter in 2018, posting an increase by 12.1 percent.

In the second quarter of 2019, Eastern Visayas ranked fifth among the regions with low fishery production in the country with 2.7 percent contribution to the country's total fishery production.

Among provinces, Samar recorded the highest volume of fishery production at 9,376 MT, comprising 30.8 percent of the total fishery production in the region.

Leyte ranked second at 6,442 MT, accounting for 21.2 percent of the region's total fish production. Southern Leyte, meanwhile, had the lowest volume of production at 1,659 MT, which only comprised 5.5 percent of the total fishery production.

Volume of production in commercial fishing went up by 49.2 percent, from 2,833 MT in the second quarter of 2018 to 4,227 MT in the same quarter of 2019.

All provinces registered increases in commercial fishing, except Southern Leyte and Leyte posting a decline of 52.0 percent and 15.4 percent, respectively.

Samar, meanwhile, reg-

istered the highest volume of production in the second quarter of 2019 at 1,941 MT, accounting for 45.9 percent of the total commercial fishery production in the region.

Samar Island dominated (Eastern Samar, Samar and Northern Samar) the municipal fishery (both marine and inland fishing) production in Eastern Visayas with 76.4 percent combined share to the total municipal fishery (both marine and inland fishing) production in Eastern Visayas during the second quarter of 2019.

Biliran, meanwhile, registered the lowest contribution with 6.3 percent share or 1,214 MT during the second quarter of 2019.

The region's total volume of production in municipal fishing (both marine and inland fishing) registered an increase by 6.2 percent, from 18,238 MT in the second quarter of 2018 to 19,373 MT in the same quarter of 2019. All provinces registered increases in municipal fishing, except Samar, which recorded a slight decline of 1.2 percent. Northern Samar recorded the highest increase by 16.4 percent, from 3,397 MT in the second quarter of 2018 to 3,954 MT during the second quarter of 2019.

Volume of production in aquaculture recorded an increase by 12.5 percent, from 6,052 MT in the second quarter of 2018 to 6,808 MT in the same period of 2019.

All provinces registered increases in aquaculture, except Samar and Northern Samar which recorded a decline in production by 19.4 percent and 5.7 percent, respectively.

Among provinces, Leyte topped the production of aquaculture at 4,358 MT, comprising 64.0 percent of the total aquaculture production in the region. Samar ranked second at 2,038 MT, accounting to 29.9 percent share of the region's total aquaculture production. Biliran, meanwhile, registered the lowest contribution with 0.2 percent share or 11 MT during the second quarter of 2019.

More than three fifths or 63.7 percent (19,373 MT) of the total fishery production in the region constituted municipal fishing. Aquaculture contributed 22.4 percent (6,808 MT), while commercial fishing accounted for 13.9 percent (4,227 MT). (PR)

Maasin City vet holds mass dog castration

MAASIN CITY-A total of 12 dogs were castrated during the one-day mass dog castration conducted by the Maasin City LGU through its Veterinary Office, September 25.

The activity, funded by the city government of Maasin, prepared vials of anesthesia, antibiotics, anti-vomiting medicines and other needed supplies for the said purpose, Dr. Rams Dizon, veterinarian, said.

"Each vial of anesthesia can serve an average of 3-4 dogs depending on the weight of the dog, Dizon said.

Maasin City has a total dog population of 7,551 based on its 2018 records.

"Weekly castration and anti-rabies vaccination were done regularly, though it depends on the availability of

vaccines, among other medicines," he said.

Meanwhile, a total of 800 anti-rabies vaccines sourced from the city government funds were just delivered this week and another 600 vials (same vaccines) were handed by the Provincial Veterinary Office through the P1.4 million allocated anti-rabies vaccines of the provincial government which was requested last year.

"A vial of anti-rabies vaccine can vaccinate nine dogs," Dizon said.

The anti-rabies vaccine form the local government can support the shortage of anti-rabies shots from the Department of Agriculture - Bureau of Animal Industry (DA-BAI).

Leyte Poverty Reduction, Livelihood, and Employment Cluster (PRLEC) led by TESDA (Technical Education and Skills and Development Authority) Leyte braved the challenging steep mountains to bring its programs and services to Brgy. San Antonio, Hilongos, Leyte on September 11, 2019 and Brgy. Casiongan, Calubian, Leyte on September 19, 2019.

The two barangays are among the 13 pilot communities identified by the Philippine Army 78th and 93rd Infantry Battalion. The cluster intends to bring the programs and services of the government through a convergence efforts of the

different member agencies right at the doorstep of the beneficiaries.

“One of the avenues to empower the marginalized is through interventions for sustainable livelihood through TESDA scholarship programs,” said TESDA Leyte Provincial Director Loreta D. Banario.

Casiongan Chairman Edgardo S. Pedida and council presented the current socio-economic status of the barangay.

Leyte PRLEC representatives in turn addressed the possible interventions that their respective agencies may offer at hand.

The cluster’s battle cry for this convergence program of the government is “Sabay sabay na hakbang tungo sa kapayapaan at kaunlaran sa probinsya ng Leyte.” (PR)

Task Force ELCAC already in place in 35 towns, 2 cities of Eastern Visayas

TACLOBAN CITY-Local Task Forces to End Local Communist Armed Conflict (ELCAC) have already been organized in 35 towns and two cities in Region 8.

DILG 8 said that in the province of Leyte, the city of Ormoc and five other municipalities namely, Bato, Burauen, Inopacan, San Isidro and Tunga, have already organized their respective City/Municipal Task Force ELCAC per Executive Order 70.

In the province of Southern Leyte, Municipal Task Force ELCAC has been organized in nine municipalities, namely, Liloan, Limasawa, Malitbog, Padre Burgos, San Juan, Silago, Pintuyan, St. Bernard and Sogod.

There are six municipalities in Samar province which have organized their respective Municipal Task Force ELCAC. These include Talalora, Paranas, Basey, Hinabangan, Tagapul-an, and Gandara.

In the province of Eastern Samar, Task Force ELCAC is in place in the only city of Borongan, and in eight municipalities namely, Balangkayan, Can-avid, Dolores, Hernani, Maslog, Salcedo, San Julian and Sulat.

was active in politics and organizations. A consistent scholar, he earned plenty of academic achievements, tagged by his teachers as a brilliant young man. I then looked up to him as a model, a guide, a leader.

In showbiz, there were also lots of personalities that I kind of idolized. Fernando Poe Jr. was one of them, followed by other action stars like Rudy Fernandez, Lito Lapid, and many more. Teen celebrities such as Gabby Concepcion and his contemporaries likewise caught my attention into activating my youthful feelings toward my crushes. The superb komiks illustrators like Mar Santana, Rod Santiago, Nar Castro and many more inspired me to be-

come a visual artist myself. Music composers like Jose Mari Chan, the Beatles, Apo Hiking Society, Rey Valera, and many others influenced me to likewise write musical compositions. Painters like Fernando Amorsolo, Juan Luna, and many more had inspired me to paint as well. Then writers such Rizal, Sionil Jose, del Pilar, Jouaquin, and numerous more kind of taught me how to put pen to paper. Behind every aspect of my varied propensities are people who excelled in their fields and proved worthy to emulate.

After graduating from Samar National School, I decided to enroll in Samar College, a private school. I just learned that this school was the premier institution for teacher education at the time throughout the Samar island. I wanted to take up Architecture, or Fine Arts,

UEP men's volleyball team to compete in University Games

TACLOBAN CITY-After ruling men's volleyball in last year's Regional State Colleges and Universities Athletic Association (SCUAA) meet, the University of Eastern Philippines Bulls will test their mettle in a high-level competition.
